GEORGE FRANCIS SEVENTY YEARS ON



George is a well known figure across Sussex ringing and he has just celebrated another milestone, seventy years since he started ringing.

He was born at The Bax Castle just south west of Horsham and was taught to ring at Itchingfield. At this time only call changes were rung with the occasional attempt at a plain course of Grandsire Doubles. Other youngsters were taught to ring there and this has provided George with life long ringing friends. In the early days of his ringing George arranged cycling holidays as far as Pembrokeshire and back in two weeks. He also started peal ringing and was in a number of first peals for the SCACR through the 1950s and 60s. He

conducted many peals and would often be ringing round the heavy end. His connection then started with Warnham when he was asked to go and teach a new band there.

Handbell ringing was introduced to his repertoire and the Warnham Handbell Team was legendary in tune ringing circles. George also rings changes on hand bells; and as many will know is the owner of the Bell Meadow Peal which are a mini ring of ten bells hung in his garage, the largest bell weighing 21lbs.

George is always generous with his time and hospitality, and is very keen on teaching and the progress of ringers. Over the last few years he has been supportive of Association events with young ringers, even giving a base for the Meadow Minis.

To mark his seventy years of ringing he took part in a peal of Grandsire Caters at Warnham on Sunday, 7 December 2014. Each of those taking part have rung

with George for over thirty years. Although he did not conduct the peal one of his compositions was used; composing is another of his ringing talents!

A fine set of 8 diatonic Whitechapel Hand Bells.

Sizes no.15C up to no.8C (no case);

Pitch A = 440 Hz.

Purchased with enthusiasm 25 years ago by tower bell ringers, but never actually used. They have been stored in a domestic environment (ie not somewhere cold and damp!). They all strike well and should need no adjustment. The bells have never been polished. They can be seen and trialled in Lewes.
