Eastern District Divisional Practice at Benenden

On Saturday tie 18th March a district practice was held at Benenden. This was a rare opportunity to ring at a 12-bell tower where practice is usually reserved for established 12-bell ringers and was enthusiastically taken up by a number of ringers from across the district.

Fifteen people attended from towers including Eastbourne, Wadhurst, Ticehurst and Salehurst. Even though we were short of 12-bell experts we still rang methods up to Caters to a good standard.

With Alastair MacFadyen in charge we warmed up with a touch of Bob Minor whilst waiting for others to arrive and then rang rounds on ten and twelve. Although this was a new experience for most of us, even the relatively new ringers quickly settled into ringing on higher numbers of bells. On twelve, the bells ring incredibly close together which makes correct striking a real challenge but when it is achieved and you can hear every bell in the round it sounds incredible. The other problem is the sheer amount of time it takes for the round to get back to you after ringing your bell – on the

lighter bells you practically have to stand your bell after each stroke and wait. This took some getting used to but everyone managed it with a bit of practice.

One consequence of having relatively few ringers was that you got to do a lot of ringing. Grandsire Triples was called next, followed by Grandsire Caters. That sounded too advanced for me so I took the Tenor – my first time covering to ten bells. Not too bad, I could see which one was at the back o.k. – except Alastair kept telling me to close up. Apparently, I was leaving too big a gap and should cover by listening rather than looking – something to take on board.

Next, we rang Stedman Triples. This is something I can do or so I thought, so I took the five. Well, I thought I could ring it but I started by going in instead of out. On the re-start it was going well until Alastair called "Bob". Oh no, I thought, I've only ever rung a plain course before, perhaps I should have said. So, trying to recall the table of Bobs that I'd looked at, I made 5ths – but then what? Then Alastair was telling me to double dodge down and go in quick –thank goodness, he's an expert.

After that I went back to covering, which seemed safer. We then rang some more rounds on ten and twelve and finished by plain hunting on ten, which was a new experience for many of us, and then it was time to go home.

It was an enjoyable practice. Many thanks to Alastair for conducting the session and to the Lebons for the use of their tower. Benenden is a delightful tower to ring at and I hope they restart open practices there soon.

Dallington Ringers Outing to Kent

Well it was certainly a beautiful sunny day for our Outing. Travelling in 3 cars we all arrived in good time for our first



tower, which was St Michael, Kingsnorth (6) 8-1-6. They are rung from a gallery, just a few steps up into the tower. Here we rang, Grandsire, Rounds and call changes, Bastow Doubles and Stedman Doubles methods. They are much lighter in weight than our ring at Dallington so we had some adjusting to do in our brains, but everyone seemed to manage it. There is no ringing band here at present and has been so for a number of years. The church has recently been updated with the pews removed and new ones installed. You might have seen this as an item on the local news on the television last week.

Off then to Warehorne, (6) 9-2-8 a very pretty spot, some wanted to return here even before we had rung, might have been the very inviting Woolpack pub opposite the church. A ground floor ring, rustic flooring permitting. Our methods rung again with some success, but here the bells are on plain bearings, so require more pulling.

They had been very recently oiled for us, we really appreciated that. Lastly, we rang at High Halden (6) 13cwt Another ground floor ring. These were significantly heavier than ours, especially the back bells, should have had Weetabix X3 for breakfast. We rang our repertoire and an additional Plain Bob Doubles touch.
