

## What's happened around the District?

## Sussex Quarter Peal week: facts & figures for the North - by Sandra Alford

April 1-8 saw lots of people busy in their gardens, either cutting the grass or drinking Pimms, due to the warmer weather arriving. It also saw the Northern District joining in with Sussex Quarter Peal week. As of lunchtime Monday 10<sup>th</sup> April (to make the Northern News deadline), our stats look like this -

- 1. 12 quarter peals were scored in the District, including one handbell quarter
- 8 towers and 1 venue were involved Ardingly, 15 Bell Road (Warnham), Bell Meadow (Warnham) - 4 quarters here, East Grinstead, Horsham, Rusper, Slinfold, Warnham (St Margaret's) and West Hoathly
- Methods rung Doubles (3m), Doubles (1P, 9m, 9v), Grandsire Caters, Grandsire Triples, Kent Treble Bob Maximus, London Surprise Major, Plain Bob Doubles, Plain Bob Minor, Plain Bob Triples, St Clements College Bob Minor, Stedman Triples and Yorkshire Surprise Maximus
- 37 Northern District ringers were involved Sandra Alford rang in 6 (a ladies <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> peal day helped with that), Simon Alford in 5, Jeremy Alford, Rachel Edwards, George Francis, Margaret Oram and Stephen Pocock rang in 3 each, Andrew Alford, Mike Cattell, Richard Pendlebury, Stephanie Pendlebury and Ian Wiltshire rang in 2 each.
- 5. Firsts scored huge congratulations to Julie Quinn (from Cuckfield) and James White (from West Hoathly) on ringing their first quarter peals (hope you enjoyed them!), Andrew Alford on his first of Treble Bob Major, Steph Pendlebury on her first of Stedman and to Hilary Smith (from Hailsham) for her first quarter in Plain Bob Triples as Conductor rung at Bell Meadow.

Ringers from other Districts also took part in some of these quarter peals. Two of these quarter peals were rung just outside of the dates but were linked to the event. I am aware of at least one other quarter peal attempt that unfortunately wasn't successful.

Saturday the first of April 2017, midmorning, and the second South East Youth Striking Competition was well underway. The order in which the teams would ring had been chosen (Sussex Young Ringers fitting in first, with Young Sussex Ringers being the final team to ring), and after a fairly groggy start, we eventually made our way up to the tower- with the other team staying downstairs to listen (and eat more cake, of course).

Overall, both teams found that the bells were a decent

ring, although the front two bells were noted as being 'rather flighty,' and the fifth was slightly odd struck. However, many members of the two Sussex teams said they handled well, and I'm sure the other teams had very few qualms with the bells. After each team had made use of their twenty-minute slot, there was more ringing to be done as we all eagerly awaited the results, but of course made time for more cake and quirky photos too!





Finally, the results were in and both Sussex Young Ringers and Young Sussex Ringers were delighted to hear that we came First (86%) and Second (73%) respectively (an enormous thanks to Anne and Sandra for all their help and encouragement!). ## The Society of Royal Cumberland Youths visits Warnham - by Ian Oram

If you were passing Warnham church on the afternoon of 11th March you might have noticed many bell ringers around the Parish Room enjoying tea and cake. No, they were not all youngsters: in fact, the Society has members from age 14 to over 90 and the membership is not only in the U.K. but across the world.

Tradition has it that the bells of Shoreditch were being rung during the return of the Duke of Cumberland from the Battle of Culloden in 1746, hence the name. The Society was formed the following year and has its current headquarters at the church of St Martin in the Fields in London.



The Society promotes a high standard of ringing as well as being friendly and sociable. The latter aspect was much to the fore on this occasion. A business meeting was held in the early evening, followed by an excellent meal prepared and served in the Village Hall by the Warnham Ringers. Almost everyone in the Warnham band had a part to play in hosting this event and the visitors left, noting that the cooking was as good as the bells!

## Other News

#### Farewell to Derek Slater, Former Tower Captain at West Hoathly - by Roger James

Derek Slater, a former tower captain at West Hoathly, has died at the age of 85. At his funeral, there on 21<sup>st</sup> February a quarter peal of Bob Minor was rung halfmuffled during and after the interment by Lynn Wilson (Ardingly captain), Sandra Alford, Rachel Edwards (the present West Hoathly tower captain), David Kirkcaldy, Jeremy Alford and David Smith (conductor).



Derek came from the West Midlands, but he moved

south to further his career. The peak of his ringing years at West Hoathly was in the 1960s. In later years, ill health compelled him to give up ringing over a period of time. He was an engineer by profession and this spilled over into many mechanical projects in his spare time. He was closely involved in the rehanging of the West Hoathly bells in a steel frame in 1962. The West Hoathly ringers, led by Derek, formed a good minor band in the 1960s though he recalled in later years how this changed almost overnight as ringers left or were unable to continue. He was also involved with the Surprise band at East Grinstead in those years.

#### PR Matters Day at Wellesbourne - by Steph Pendlebury

In February, myself, Richard Pendlebury, Alison Everett (SCACR Communication & Events Team Leader), Mandie Merlin and Jason Crouch went on an excellent Public Relations conference run by the Central Council. Very engaging and helpful talks were interspersed with discussion sessions.
