November 2017 saw the launch of a national Ringing Remembers initiative to commemorate 100 years since the end of World War One. 'Ringing Remembers' is promoted by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government and the Central Council of Church Bellringers in collaboration with the Big Ideas Company who are publicising the campaign across social media and have created a poster for us to put it up in church and village notice boards.

The Ringing Remembers campaign aims to recruit at least 1400 new recruits to ringing in time for them to be trained and join Remembrance Day ringing 11 November 2018, 100 years since Armistice Day.

Highlights of the programme The 2018 Central Council Meeting, organised by The Administrative Committee, is to take place at Lancaster University in the North West of England over the second Bank Holiday weekend in May. It is the first of a new style of annual conference planned to tour the regions. The university offers high class conference facilities, catering and accommodation at reasonable prices and enables most of the events over the weekend to take place on the University campus.

The conference will be spread over three days with workshops, seminars, and sessions that will be open to all ringers as well as members of the Council. It is however of a new format that will enable it to be condensed into two days in future when the envisaged date move to the first weekend in September takes place in 2019.

The formal opening session of the Council will be on the Sunday afternoon to encompass the welcome, obituaries, election of life and additional members and also the formal reports of the various stewards, before adjourning to the President's Reception and Annual Dinner.

The Monday session of the Council will include the business of committee reports and motions along with break-out sessions to debate pertinent issues and review in detail the Council's work. A local regional ringing association will be invited to address the Council on the state of ringing in their area and this year it will feature The Lancashire Association.

The Council will offer an "all-in" conference package as well as day and individual event rates. The package is essentially full board and inclusive of conference fees.

Thank You Nick Cant this extract from your report to members at the ADM:

We hope to continue to run, when possible, Surprise Major practices jointly with Southern District. Of necessity, the venues in our district will be at the western end of the district to minimise the travel required for those from the South. Unfortunately, despite encouragement to continue these practices, the turnout on a number of occasions has been disappointing, and on at least 2 occasions, insufficient to actually ring on 8 bells. I shall send an e-mail to regular and possible attenders and publicise on Facebook and the SCACR website as soon as some possible dates can be arranged.

I also hope to continue our "Progressing in minor" practices, probably at Alfriston. We have concentrated each session on a special method each month – alternating between plain methods and treble bob or surprise minor. This gives ringers the opportunity to

commit time to mastering a particular method, and also gives the chance of plain hunting or treble bobbing to those whose progression has reached that stage.

Other organised practices are now more localised. The Eastbourne towers joint practices on up to 8 bells at St Mary's and Christ Church are planned for 2 Tuesdays each month, while maintaining individual practices on the remaining weeks. Ringers from other District towers are more than welcome to join these practices. Similarly, once every 3 months there is an Eastbourne practice (again on a Tuesday) at St Saviour's on up to 10 bells.

Future dates planned are at Christ Church on 6th March and 3rd April. St Mary's would normally be on the last Tuesday of the month, but will not take place in March as it falls in Holy Week.

The more basic handling and method learning continues mostly within individual towers. It is difficult to put on District practices for this that many people are able or willing to attend. However, if any particular tower, or individual ringers, would like help in progressing from some more-experienced ringers, then please do contact me or any Committee member, and we can discuss what assistance can be arranged. Similarly, if any towers feel they could progress by combining their practices, then we would be glad to assist arranging this.

Any suggestions for advancing co-operation between towers or arranging for local or District-wide practices would always be welcome, and we would love to see more ringers involved in these.

Communications and Events update February 2018

The Armistice 100 Ringing Remembers website is now open. If anyone started learning since the beginning of November 2017 or was inspired by the campaign to return to ringing, this is where they can register to be part of the Armistice 100 band for Ringing Remembers.

Some Guilds have opened a group of towers as a Recruitment exercise, which we might consider - Learning as part of a group seems to work better than individually - for children and adults. Four of the six ringers who have come to Sussex via the campaign are learning, and there will be more from local advertising.

Budding bell ringers across Devon are being encouraged to get behind a national Ringing Remembers initiative to commemorate 100 years since the end of World War One.

"Ringing Remembers" is promoted by the Department of Local Government & Communities and the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers. It aims to gain at least 1400 new recruits to ringing in time for them to be trained and join the Remembrance Day ringing on 11 November this year.

In Devon over 60 ringers are known to have given their lives in the 1914-18 war and at least six of these came from the Tiverton and Culm Valley areas. A county-wide event takes place on Saturday, February 24.

Selected churches will open their towers that morning for people to drop in and find out about learning to ring tower bells. There will be displays, videos, a chance to talk to ringers and to see the bells. You can also have a go at ringing a bell. The aim will be to encourage people to take up bell ringing in time for Remembrance Sunday and, it is hoped, to continue their ringing careers afterwards.

Tiverton St Peter's will be welcoming visitors between 10:00am and noon as will St Mary's, Silverton. In the afternoon St Mary's, Hemyock will open between 2:00pm and 4:30pm, while Bampton church will be open 4:00pm – 6:00pm.

Leslie Boyce from St Peter's Church said: "What is so special about bell ringing? Apart from making a glorious sound ringing, it is an excellent way to keep fit – rather than use a "dumb" bell, why not use a real bell?

It's also a great team activity and offers the more ambitious student limitless opportunities to learn new methods — a real mental workout. People of all ages from 10 to 70 can be ringers and no great physical strength is required. Once a ringer, you also have a community of friends throughout the country who will welcome you into their own towers to ring. This allows you to visit some amazing and historic places as well. Learning to ring takes anything from a few weeks to several months depending on how much time the learner can give. At least weekly practice is the normal commitment needed and learners can follow a national training scheme, "Learning the Ropes", which has a clear pathway and targets. Individual tuition is offered in the first stages and then, once able to handle a bell on their own, learners join in with other ringers."
