#### We are champions of the South East... Again!

On Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> of April, teams from across the South East of England came to Warnham to compete to be crowned the 2018 South East Youth striking champions. This year there were teams from Kent, Essex, Guildford, Hertfordshire and (of course) Sussex.

The day started with an introduction from organiser Anne Franklin and we were soon on our feet, fuelled by a ridiculous amount of cake, handbell ringing and open ringing on the 'Bell Meadow' mini-ring hosted by George Francis. There was a lot to do!

Sussex was drawn to ring last, but this didn't deter us. When our time came we ascended the tower steps, had a practice run and then started our test

ringing. We produced 160 rows of immaculate call changes which we learned, when the judges passed their comments, were "the best speed of the day" and "very pleasing to listen to".

After the contest ringing was over, we descended on the primary school for a Fish and Chip lunch followed by the announcement of the results. Team Sussex was thrilled to win for the third year running, closely followed by Kent in second place.

The day was not yet over.
We went onwards to Rusper and Horsham for more ringing with young ringers from across the south.

Our thanks go to Anne for organising a brilliant day. Our next competition is the Ringing World National Youth Contest in July, this year being hosted by Southwark Cathedral in London. We look forward to it!

Next young ringers practice dates to arrive soon! All young ringers are warmly welcome. It's really good fun!

## **Important Safeguarding Information**

So... have you thought about doing the Diocese of Chichester on line safeguarding training yet? Everyone involved with the church, in any way, should be aware of safeguarding and child protection issues. Tower Captains and anyone involved with the training of young people or transporting young people must still complete the C1 and C2 training every 3 years. You can book yourself onto training Diocese of Chichester training courses. Or your parish safeguarding officer can arrange it for you. And for everyone else there is the C0 on line training. It takes about an hour to complete.

Here's what to do... Go to

https://safeguarding.chichester.anglican.org

Click on 'training event'

On the left side of the page you will find E learning, which is what you need. At the bottom of the page is the safeguarding portal, which will take you to the on line courses. *(continues on next page)* 

At this stage you will need to create a new account.

The course is 1 hour long. You are able to stop and start, go back over bits.

Safeguarding is everyones responsibility. Currently, there is a lot of media coverage about historic abuse by church members, and particularly the response by the Diocese of Chichester to allegations that were made. Always, always believe what a young person may tell you and report what has been said to your parish safeguarding officer, to me, to the police. Keeping children safe is the responsibility of everyone.

#### SEECON 2018 (South East of England Contest)

The South East of England Contest, now in its third year, is a striking competition for young ringers. This year five teams took part.

The competition was held at Warnham
on Saturday, 14th April. The weather was
absolutely perfect for a competition, warm
and sunny, which meant ringers could play
around, socialise and catch up with old
friends from other societies. Tea, coffee,
and most importantly lots and lots of cakes,
were provided throughout the whole day,
making sure all ringers had plenty of energy.
During the competition ringing, handbell
workshops were run inside and outside the
church, along with a handbell quarter peal
rung by the Society of Kent Young Ringers.
Along the road from the church was a miniring called The Bell Meadow Peal which the
competitors were all invited to visit. Thank
you to George Francis for the use of his
mini-ring.

During the lunch break, another handbell quarter was rung. I am led to believe we emptied the fish and chip shop, with everyone having chips and possibly something else. Once all the food was eaten, the judges (Tom Neal and Becca Cullen) came to deliver the results: Young@Herts were 5th, GDGYR (Guildford) 4th, Essex Young Eagles 3rd, Kent Young Ringers 2nd and Sussex Young Ringers 1st, for the third year running. The judges had said they had to re-listen to the recordings to choose 1st and 2nd, so good going Kent and Sussex.

After the results, two other towers, Rusper and Horsham, were open for the ringers to visit on their way back home. Finally it was time for 'thank yous', 'well dones' and 'good byes'. It was an excellent day for all young and old ringers.
